Broombush	A hardy shrub of the Malaleuca family, often grown for use in brushwood fencing	2007

Lemongrass	A scented grass that grows wild and is native to the Pilbara region	2007	
Mistletoe	Attaches itself to a host plant to grow and called a weed by some, but feeds birds.	2007	
Oilgrass	Native plant. Cymbopogon bombycinus (Silky Oilgrass, Silky Heads, Citronella Grass) This grass is endemic to Australia. It occurs in eucalypt forests and savannas of tropical and subtropical Australia on sandy or stony soils. Usually grows on hillsides in well-drained soils.	1998 and 2007	
Plumbush	Native plant. Plumbush, Northern Sandalwood Santalum lanceolatum. Shrub or small tree to 7m. Rough grey bark and medium sized grey leaves with small clusters of cream flowers. The red berries are about 1cm in diameter and become dark purple or black when ripe. The sweet-tasting fruit was eaten raw. They are reputed to be slightly narcotic. A boiled infusion of the leaves and bark was consumed as a purgative. A poultice of the roots was applied to treat rheumatism. Mudskipper	Local fish. A goby (fish) with its eyes on raised bumps on top of the head, found in mangrove swamps from East Africa to Australia. It moves about on land with great agility, often basking on mud or mangrove roots.	1998	
Octopus	Local fish.	1998	
Seagull	Local bird. A Seagull is a long-winged web-footed aquatic bird from the Laridae family.	1998	
Triller	The name follows theme of bird species for the development. A small passerine bird of the genus Lalage belonging to the cuckoo-shrike family Campephagidae, so called because of the loud trilling calls of the male birds. A small, compact bird with short legs and long wings. Trillers often shuffle and refold their wings after landing	2007
