DECLARATION OF INTERESTS (NOTES FOR YOUR GUIDANCE) (updated 13 March 2000)

A member who has a **Financial Interest** in any matter to be discussed at a Council or Committee Meeting, which will be attended by the member, must disclose the nature of the interest:

- (a) In a written notice given to the Chief Executive Officer before the Meeting or;
- (b) At the Meeting, immediately before the matter is discussed.

A member, who makes a disclosure in respect to an interest, must not:

- (c) Preside at the part of the Meeting, relating to the matter or;
- (d) Participate in, or be present during any discussion or decision-making procedure relative to the matter, unless to the extent that the disclosing member is allowed to do so under Section 5.68 or Section 5.69 of the *Local Government Act 1995*.

NOTES ON FINANCIAL INTEREST (FOR YOUR GUIDANCE)

The following notes are a basic guide for Councillors when they are considering whether they have a **Financial Interest** in a matter. I intend to include these notes in each agenda for the time being so that Councillors may refresh their memory.

1. A Financial Interest requiring disclosure occurs when a Council decision might advantageously or detrimentally affect the Councillor or a person closely associated with the Councillor and is capable of being measure in money terms. There are exceptions in the *Local Government Act 1995* but they should not be relied on without advice, unless the situation is very clear.
2. If a Councillor is a member of an Association (which is a Body Corporate) with not less than 10 members i.e. sporting, social, religious etc), and the Councillor is not a holder of office of profit or a guarantor, and has not leased land to or from the club, i.e., if the Councillor is an ordinary member of the Association, the Councillor has a common and not a financial interest in any matter to that Association.
3. If an interest is shared in common with a significant number of electors or ratepayers, then the obligation to disclose that interest does not arise. Each case needs to be considered.
4. If in doubt declare.
5. As stated in (b) above, if written notice disclosing the interest has not been given to the Chief Executive Officer before the meeting, then it **MUST** be given when the matter arises in the Agenda, and immediately before the matter is discussed.
6. Ordinarily the disclosing Councillor must leave the meeting room before discussion commences. The **only** exceptions are:
 - 6.1 Where the Councillor discloses the **extent** of the interest, and Council carries a motion under s.5.68(1)(b)(ii) or the *Local Government Act*; or
 - 6.2 Where the Minister allows the Councillor to participate under s5.69 (3) of the *Local Government Act*, with or without conditions.

INTERESTS AFFECTING IMPARTIALITY

DEFINITION: *An interest that would give rise to a reasonable belief that the impartiality of the person having the interest would be adversely affected, but does not include an interest as referred to in Section 5.60 of the 'Act'.*

A member who has an **Interest Affecting Impartiality** in any matter to be discussed at a Council or Committee Meeting, which will be attended by the member, must disclose the nature of the interest;

- (a) in a written notice given to the Chief Executive Officer before the Meeting; or
- (b) at the Meeting, immediately before the matter is discussed.

IMPACT OF AN IMPARTIALITY CLOSURE

There are very different outcomes resulting from disclosing an interest affecting impartiality compared to that of a financial interest. With the declaration of a financial interest, an elected member leaves the room and does not vote.

With the declaration of this new type of interest, the elected member stays in the room, participates in the debate and votes. In effect then, following disclosure of an interest affecting impartiality, the member's involvement in the Meeting continues as if no interest existed.

This table shows a surplus position of \$49.3m, a positive variance of \$7.8m compared to the budgeted surplus position of \$41.4m, which reflects timing of transactions associated with projects.

The restricted balance referred to in the preceding table and throughout this report comprises of Pilbara Underground Power (PUPP) Service Charges levied in 2014/15, which are subject to the 10-year instalment option offered by Council.

The following variances contribute significantly to the total YTD variance shown in the above table.

While the City is in a strong financial position, the impact of the COVID-19 pandemic has, and will continue to have a significant impact on the City’s short/medium term financial position. Revenues from many areas have fallen, or are projected to fall, including:

- Airport revenues as a result of hard state and intrastate border closures;
- Fee revenues from facilities as a result of closures;
- Lease fee revenue due to rent relief and leases linked to turnover;
- Collection of rates levied is projected to be slower; and
- Receipt of debtor payments is likely to be slower impacting cash flows.

Current Assets increased by 50.31% from July to August, which was attributable to the levying of rates for the 2020/21 financial year. Current Liabilities decreased by 29.28% compared to July due to payment of accounts payable. Non-Current Assets decreased slightly by 0.03% and was attributable to disposal of minor assets. There has been no change to Non- Current Liabilities from last month.

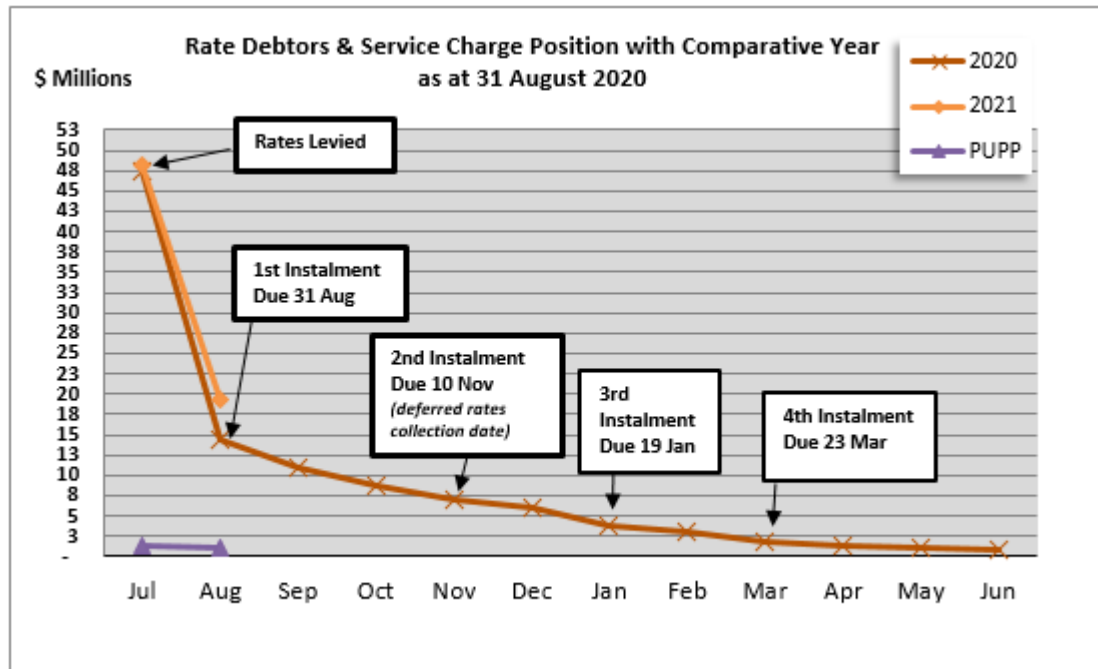

The significant movement in the 60 day ageing balance is attributed to contributions from Woodside and Department of Education. Further details are included in the subsequent debtors table.

A total of \$29m of rates (including ESL and waste charges) has been paid to end of August, representing a collection rate of 60% to date.



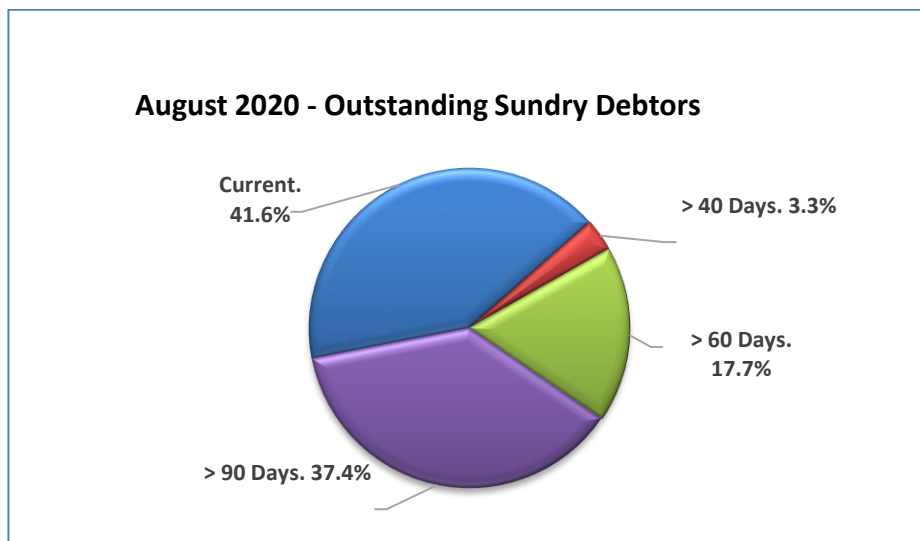
There was a decrease of 8% from July in the PUPP Debtors balance. PUPP payments have now been received on 99.6% of properties, and of those paid 98.20% have paid in full with 1.80% paying by instalments.

Collection of outstanding debts greater than 40 days is continuing in line with Council policy. The following table highlights outstanding balances for each ageing period for Trade Debtor balances in excess of \$5,000.

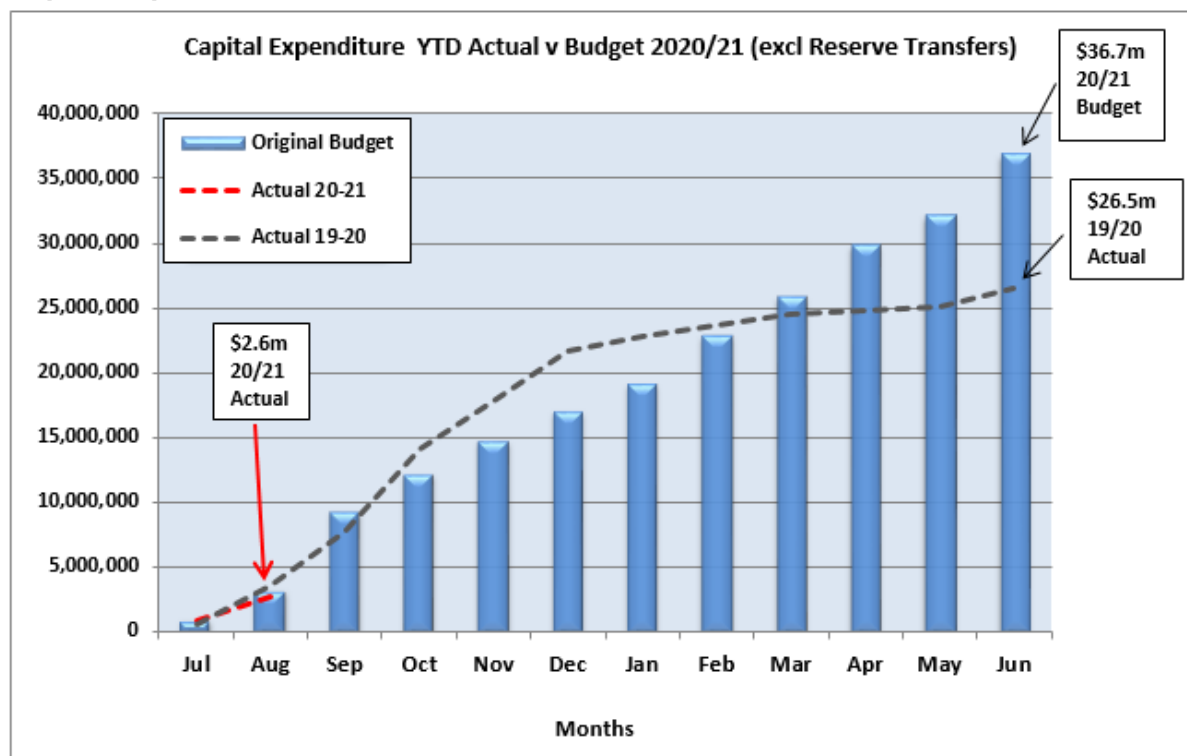

The impact of the COVID-19 global pandemic has resulted in an increase in outstanding balances for amounts greater than 60 and 90 day ageing periods. This is particularly evident for small businesses and community organisations. Council has implemented measures to support the community and local businesses in these areas, including the COVID-19 Community Assistance Fund as well as lease fee deferrals and other initiatives.



Capital Expenditure



Council’s current Capital Expenditure budget for 2020/21 is \$36.7m with the majority associated with major projects including Street & Roads Reseal Program, Karratha CBD Re-planting Program, Andover Park Redevelopment Project, Hampton Pavilion Re-roofing and Solar Panelling, Welcome Rd Redevelopment, Kevin Richards Oval Lighting and other infrastructure improvements. The following table shows capital expenditure is 17.3% below budget for the month.

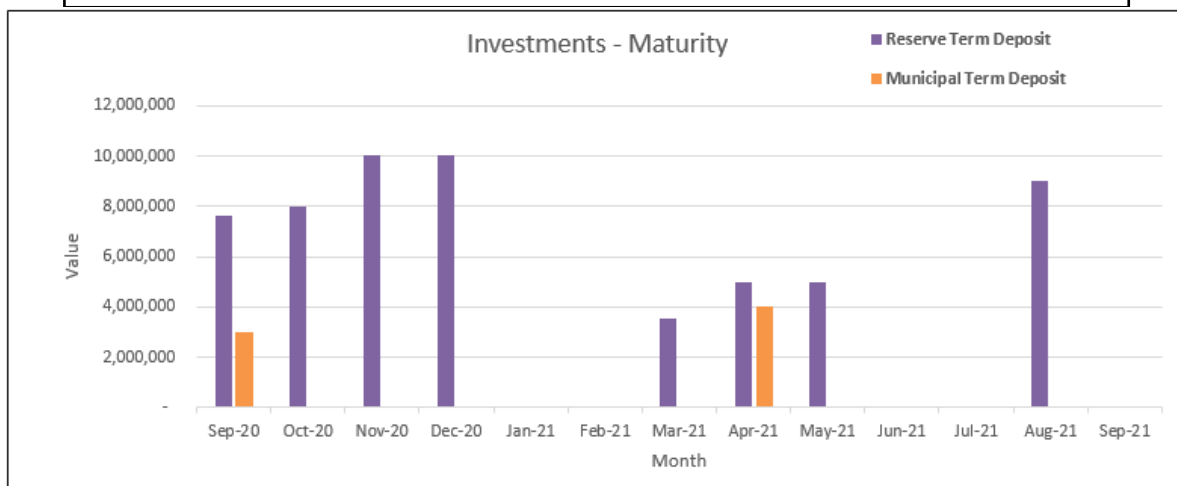
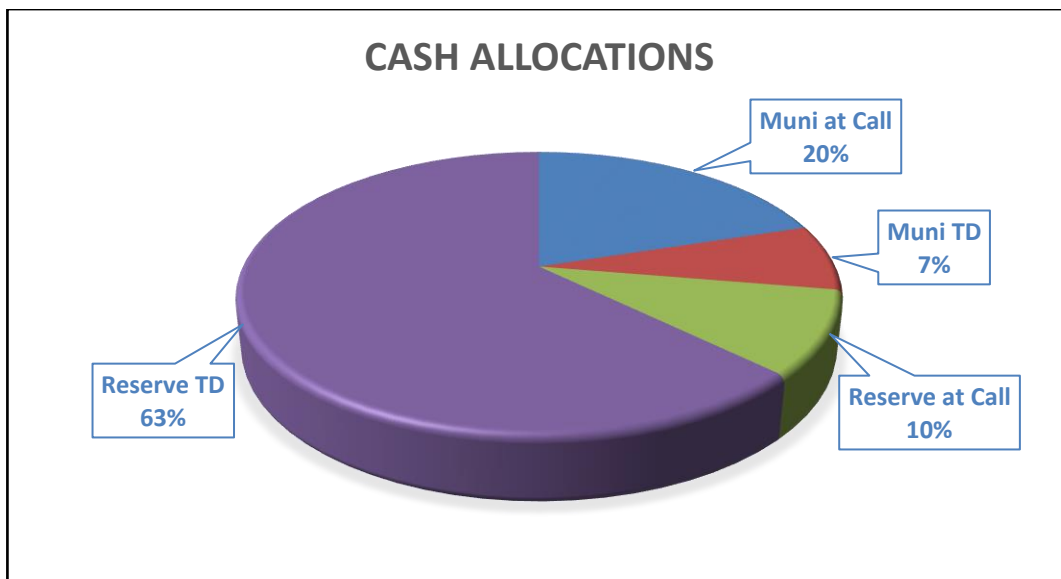

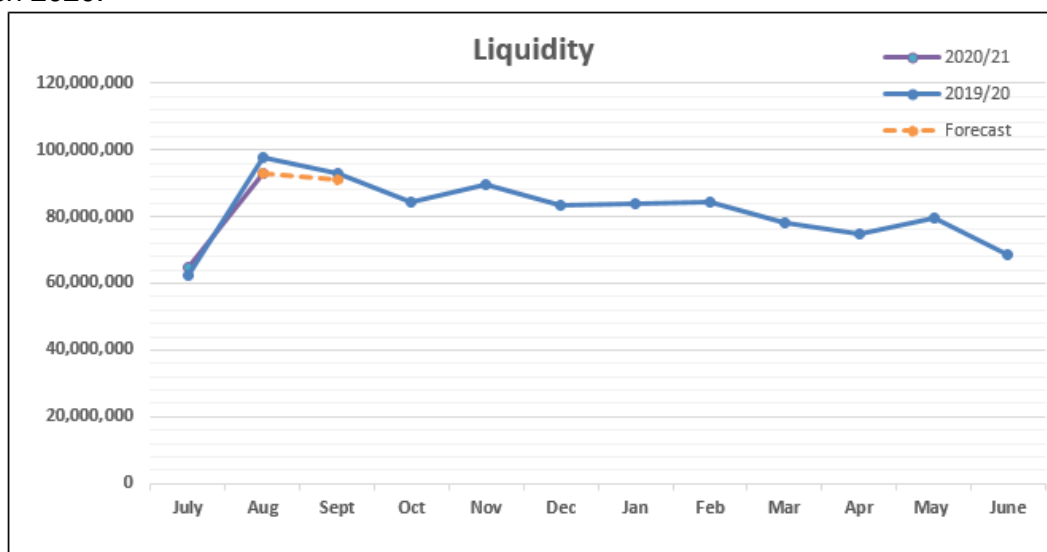

The RBA official cash rate (overnight money market interest rate) remains at 0.25% in August. Reserve funds held in the Westpac Business Premium Cash Reserve account are earning 0.85% in interest over balances of \$1m. Following on from discussions with Westpac, the Municipal Funds held with Westpac Bank are now earning 10 basis points on the daily cash balance. This amount will also be applied retrospectively to amounts held from March 2020.



The liquidity graph for 2020/21 demonstrates an increase in liquidity from July. This increase in liquidity is attributable to the collection of rates payments from bulk Ratepayers.

The impact on revenues as a result of COVID-19 have, and will continue to have, a significant impact on the City's cash liquidity. The impact of this, as well as implemented community support initiatives, continues to be closely monitored.

Other Investments

As part of Council's investment strategy, reserve funds were used to purchase a commercial property 'The Quarter HQ' in June 2017. The following table provides a summary of all income and expenditure for The Quarter for the current financial year which has been significantly impacted by rent relief offered to tenants impacted by COVID-19 and capital expenditure on lift upgrades:

Also as part of Council's investment strategy, Council resolved at its May 2020 meeting to execute a loan agreement with Scope Property Group Pty Ltd for the acquisition and redevelopment of the Dampier Shopping Centre. This loan is to be funded Reserve funds borrowings from WATC (if required) and is to be for a maximum initial term of ten years. To date, no borrowings have been required. LEVEL OF SIGNIFICANCE

Financial integrity is essential to the operational viability of the City but also as the custodian of community assets and service provision. An ability to monitor and report on financial operations, activities and capital projects is imperative to ensure that financial risk is managed at acceptable levels of comfort.

The ability for the City to remain financially sustainable is a significant strategy for a region that is continually under pressure from the resources industry, private enterprise and State Government obligations for the ongoing development of infrastructure and services.

COUNCILLOR/OFFICER CONSULTATION

Executives and Management have been involved in monthly reviews of their operational and departmental budgets and notifying the Financial Services team of trends and variances arising from their operational areas.

COMMUNITY CONSULTATION

No community consultation is required.

STATUTORY IMPLICATIONS

In accordance with the *Local Government Act 1995* and *Local Government (Financial Management) Regulations 1996*, a Statement of Financial Activity is required to be presented to Council as a minimum requirement.

Section 6.4 of the *Local Government Act 1995* provides for the preparation of financial reports.

In accordance with Regulation 34 (5) of the *Local Government (Financial Management) Regulations 1996*, a report must be compiled on variances greater than the materiality threshold adopted by Council of \$50,000 or 10% whichever is the greater. As this report is composed at a program level, variance commentary considers the most significant items that comprise the variance.

POLICY IMPLICATIONS

The Council's financial reporting is prepared in accordance with Accounting Policy CF1. This is reviewed periodically to ensure compliance with legislative and statutory obligations.

FINANCIAL IMPLICATIONS

The report represents the financial position of the Council at the end of August 2020 with a year to date budget surplus position of \$41,438,180 (comprising \$41,139,357 unrestricted surplus and \$298,823 restricted surplus) and a current surplus position of \$49,335,099 (comprising \$49,036,276 unrestricted surplus and \$298,823 restricted surplus). The restricted balance comprises PUPP service charges levied in 2014/15.

The COVID-19 pandemic has, and will continue to have, major impacts on businesses and the economy. A number of assistance packages have been made available through State and Federal Governments, Financial Institutions, Business Support Agencies, Utility Providers and Industry. In addition to these, Council has implemented a number of further stimulus and assistance packages to support residents, ratepayers, community organisations and local businesses through these difficult times.

STRATEGIC IMPLICATIONS

This item is relevant to the Council’s approved Strategic Community Plan 2020-2030 and the Corporate Business Plan 2020-2025. In particular, the Operational Plan 2020-2021 provided for this activity:

Astute financial management backed by strong internal controls, policies and monitoring will ensure risks are assessed regularly and managed appropriately. Expenditure and revenue streams are monitored against approved budgets by management and the financial team with material variances being reported. It is incumbent on all managers that any perceived extraordinary variances that have, or likely to have, occurred are escalated immediately for consideration by Executive and/or Council.

PURPOSE

To note emergency expenditure incurred to support recovery efforts post Tropical Cyclone Damien.

BACKGROUND

Tropical Cyclone Damien impacted towns and rural areas of the City of Karratha between 8 and 9 February 2020.

On 16 February 2020, Tropical Cyclone Damien was declared a natural disaster. The Minister for Emergency Services announced that Tropical Cyclone Damien had caused wide spread damage to the region and financial assistance was available to aid with the cost of clean-up and repairs for the local government areas of East Pilbara, Karratha and Port Hedland under the Disaster Recovery Funding Arrangements (DRFA) Western Australia.

On 10 February 2020, Mayor Peter Long authorised unbudgeted expenditure from the municipal fund in accordance with section 6.8(1)(c) of the *Local Government Act 1995* for the purpose of undertaking urgent remediation works to damage caused by Tropical Cyclone Damien. Where expenditure has been authorised in accordance with this provision, a report is to be presented to the next ordinary meeting of Council outlining the detail associated with that expenditure.

With damage caused by excessive winds and flooding in some areas, critical to recovery efforts has been the need to clear streets, open spaces and residential property verges of debris, most notably green waste in order to address public safety. To facilitate these works, the City required the assistance of a number of contractors (including internal preferred suppliers appointed under tender) to supplement City, State, Federal and private sector efforts. Contractors and suppliers have been engaged to assist with labour and plant hire associated with tree pruning, green waste verge collection and associated repair works, commensurate with typical rates afforded for like works.

In addition to green waste clean-up, major recovery costs were incurred in the areas of:

- Rural roads;
- Sports lighting;
- Trees and landscaping;
- Signs;
- Street lighting;
- Buildings; and
- Playgrounds.

As recovery efforts are ongoing, the final cost of the recovery is yet to be determined however, total expenditure will be reported to Council when recovery efforts are complete.

LEVEL OF SIGNIFICANCE

In accordance with Council Policy CG-8 Significant Decision Making Policy, this matter is considered to be of moderate significance in terms of Council's ability to perform its role.

COUNCILLOR/OFFICER CONSULTATION

Consultation has taken place with the Mayor to seek approval for unbudgeted expenditure for emergency provisions under the *Local Government Act 1995*.

COMMUNITY CONSULTATION

No community consultation is required.

STATUTORY IMPLICATIONS

In accordance with Part 11(2)(a) of the *Local Government Functions and General Regulations 1996*, tenders do not have to be publicly invited if the supply of the goods or services is to be obtained from expenditure authorised in an emergency under section 6.8(1)(c) of the *Local Government Act 1995* which enables expenditure to be authorised in advance by the Mayor in an emergency. Further, pursuant to section 6.8(2)(b), where expenditure has been incurred by a local government as above, it is to be reported to the next ordinary meeting of the Council.

POLICY IMPLICATIONS

Emergency Expenditure is in accordance with clause 3.11.3 of the CG12 Purchasing Policy.

FINANCIAL IMPLICATIONS

Following the adoption of the 2020/21 Annual Budget, expenditure related to Tropical Cyclone Damien is no longer unbudgeted and monthly reports summarising this expenditure are no longer required. A final report will be provided when recovery efforts are complete and total expenditure is able to be reported.

PURPOSE

For Council to consider a review of the Investment Policy (CF-03).

BACKGROUND

The current Investment Policy (CF-03) was last reviewed in July 2019 and was scheduled for the next review to occur in July 2023. Since the last review a combination of historically low interest rates and the impacts of COVID-19 have created a challenging environment in which to derive interest returns on the City’s significant municipal cash and reserve holdings. Following a review of the existing policy, including benchmarking against other regional and metropolitan local governments, a number of changes are proposed to enable greater flexibility to obtain better returns than the current policy allows. The proposed changes are summarised below:

The City’s 2020/21 Budget anticipated investment interest earnings of \$749k (down from \$1.46m in 2019/20). Since the adoption of the budget, the average interest rate achieved from A1 rated institutions has decreased from 1.12% to 0.78% representing a reduction in interest earnings of circa \$225k.

Allowing for more investment with A2 rated institutions is expected to significantly offset the reduction in interest earnings.

This report presents funding proposals received under the Large Community Grants category. Proposals have been assessed in accordance with the guidelines using the five criteria below:

1. *Strategic Alignment* – how well does the project align with and provide outcomes related to the City of Karratha’s Strategic Community Plan and stated vision of being “Australia’s most liveable regional City”?
2. *Income/Other Funding* – Will the project be able to generate income from other sources so as not to be 100% reliant on City of Karratha funding?
3. *Project Viability/Feasibility* – Is the project underpinned by a well-planned approach that will ensure the project can be delivered as intended, with minimal risks and with sound management? Has the proposal adequately demonstrated a community need/demand is being fulfilled?
4. *Community Benefit* – How many community members will be beneficiaries of the project? Is the project inclusive and open to a broad range of community groups/members? If the project is targeting a specific part of the community, has this been demonstrated in the proposal?
5. *Capacity for Delivery* – Can the project be delivered by the applicant? How much of the project is proposed to be outsourced? Will this project help build capacity by way of developing new skills or providing volunteering opportunities?

Further consultation with applicants was undertaken to gain an understanding of the purpose and benefit of their projects. Following this report, there will be further consultation with the applicants around the Council decision.

PURPOSE

For Council to note the City of Karratha's Renewable Hydrogen Industry Hub Report.

BACKGROUND

Hydrogen is an emerging technology that has an important role as the world moves to a low-carbon future. Hydrogen offers diverse applications as an energy carrier and chemical feedstock and has potential to support the energy and industrial sectors to reduce reliance on carbon producing sources. There is a growing global demand for renewable and low-emission hydrogen and the State Government's WA Hydrogen Strategy identifies many opportunities for WA in this space.

Council resolved to fund a renewable hydrogen study at the Council Meeting on 19 November 2018 (Item 10.3). The purpose of the study was to identify:

- What competitive advantages the City has that can be leveraged to attract investment in renewable hydrogen;
- How the City can attract business investment in renewable hydrogen projects;
- What complementary industries are required to support the development of the renewable hydrogen industry;
- What steps the City can take to overcome barriers, increase its profile and promote its brand in the renewable energy market; and
- What strategic partnerships the City should pursue to become WA's centre for renewable hydrogen.

The City engaged the Murdoch University Hydrogen Team and the Hydrogen Society of Australia to prepare the study during 2020 and the Report has now been completed. A copy of the Report is included as **Attachment 1**.

The Report sets out:

- The Australian context for the renewable hydrogen industry;
- Karratha's competitive advantages in developing the hydrogen industry; and
- Potential strategies that the City could employ to support the hydrogen industry.

The Report identifies nine competitive advantages for the City of Karratha in relation to establishing the hydrogen industry. These include:

1. Several large-scale hydrogen initiatives and feasibility studies occurring in the area which demonstrates there is market interest in the industry.
2. Close access to global markets, particularly Asia.
3. Access to land and water particularly from mine dewatering activities.
4. Access to renewable energy resources including solar, wind and underground caverns for hydrogen storage.
5. Existing liquid natural gas infrastructure, pipelines, ports and transport corridors.
6. Opportunity to couple hydrogen export with import trade.
7. Ability to produce low emission hydrogen at a competitive rate.
8. Having an existing strong industry presence in Karratha.
9. Having a large residential workforce and an increasingly liveable region.

There are five key themes for the recommendations from the Study, which addresses the purpose for the Study. A summary of the outcomes of the Study are as follows:

1. Policy Development

This theme identifies actions that the City can undertake to participate in the hydrogen industry. Actions include things such as:

- Ensuring that the City's regulatory and strategic framework is aligned to National and State Strategies;
- Understanding and addressing regulatory barriers for hydrogen use to support development;
- Conducting events with industry and the community to build understanding in the technology; and
- Developing pilot projects and partnering with industry to deliver them.

2. Attracting Business Investment

This theme includes actions that the City can undertake to support business investment in key supporting industries for hydrogen, including:

- Renewable energy generation;
- Hydrogen storage facilities;
- Gas network upgrades to enable hydrogen blending into the gas pipeline network;

Focus areas to support this investment include:

- Supporting skills development;
- Supporting offtake industries;
- Conduct a preliminary land supply survey; and
- Develop an investor's contact and information centre.

3. Complementary & Offtake Industries

The study identified a number of complementary and offtake industries that would support hydrogen industry and recommends that the City support investment in these industries. These include industries such as:

- Solar PV and wind turbine farm installation and maintenance industry;
- Electrical contracting companies to provide engineering, procurement, construction and commissioning;
- Renewable powered water desalination and wastewater treatment;
- Hydrogen ready gas pipeline and end user appliance industry;
- Hydrogen storage facilities including underground projects; and
- Hydrogen powered heavy vehicles and trains.

4. Establish Strategic Partnerships

It is recommended that the City establish key strategic partnerships with government, industry, research and development and education institutions to build awareness and engagement in the hydrogen industry.

5. Potential Hydrogen Projects

The study recommends that the City assess its own facilities and business areas to understand and implement hydrogen pilot projects. This may include:

- Developing a hydrogen fuelling station and migrating the City's fleet to hydrogen power;
- Transitioning to a hydrogen enabled airport; or
- Developing and implementing public hydrogen powered refuelling and electric vehicle charging facilities.

The City has recently advertised its draft Environmental Sustainability Strategy for public comment and it is recommended that the Report recommendations be considered as part of the Environmental Sustainability Strategy Implementation Plan currently being developed. Relevant economic considerations will be considered as part of the implementation of the City's Economic Development Strategy. Considerations include the City's role, financial and human resource implications in the context of delivering the City' Strategic Community Plan.

LEVEL OF SIGNIFICANCE

In accordance with Council Policy CG-8 Significant Decision Making Policy, this matter is considered to be of moderate significance in terms of future economic and environmental issues.

COUNCILLOR/OFFICER CONSULTATION

Consultation has taken place with relevant internal departments, the Mayor and with the Environment & Sustainability Advisory Group.

COMMUNITY CONSULTATION

No community consultation has occurred specifically in relation to the Report and is not required. Community engagement for the draft Environmental Sustainability Strategy is currently being undertaken and has already occurred for the Economic Development Strategy. Both strategies include a focus on transitioning to renewable energy, including hydrogen.

PURPOSE

For Council to consider revised Local Planning Policy DP07 – Amendments to the Deemed to Comply Provisions of the Residential Design Codes for advertising.

BACKGROUND

In 2019, the City engaged an external consultant to undertake a review of the City's Local Planning Policies (LPPs). The review found that the majority of the City's LPPs were outdated and/or not consistent with current legislation. The review made recommendations on whether LPPs should be revoked, consolidated or updated.

Council resolved to revoke 5 of the 22 LPPs at the August 2019 Ordinary Council Meeting, as per recommendations of the review. The next step is to update priority LPPs to ensure the City's local planning framework conforms to current legislation and reflects current local community expectations. DP07 is considered a priority policy as development in residential areas accounts for a significant volume of the total development applications received by the City. DP07 was last amended by Council in September 2016.

DP07 applies to residential development across the City of Karratha. The policy aims to protect and improve the amenity and streetscape of new and established residential areas, as well as providing amendments to the deemed-to-comply- requirements of State Planning Policy 7.3 - Residential Design Codes – Volume 1 (R-Codes). The R-Codes allows for a LPP to provide for amendments to the 'deemed to comply' provisions of certain residential design elements of the R-Codes.

The City has engaged an independent consultant, CLE Town Planning and Design, to assist in the review and subsequent update of DP07. Matters considered in updating DP07 include:

- Aligning the LPP with the State Planning Framework, including current State Planning Reform and State Planning Policy 7.3 – Residential Design Codes Volume 1;
- Ensuring the LPP is consistent with and contributes to achieving objectives of the City's Local Planning Strategy, Local Planning Scheme No.8 and other relevant Local Planning Framework;
- Ensuring the LPP considers on-the-ground issues that have arisen during the course of implementing the current adopted version of DP07;

- Undertaking of a review of other local government policy provisions relating to development in residential areas; and
- Providing a clear expectation for development standards within residential areas, which guides City Officer’s in determining applications for development approval and assists the community in consideration and preparation of applications for development approval.

The key findings following review of DP07 and the recommended updates are summarised below:

COUNCILLOR/OFFICER CONSULTATION

Officers from Building and Technical Services have provided input and been consulted.

COMMUNITY CONSULTATION

Clauses 4, 5 and 6 of Schedule 2, Part 2 of the *Planning and Development (Local Planning Schemes) Regulations 2015* requires the local government to publish a notice in the newspaper when a new local planning policy is being prepared, when an existing policy is being amended and when a policy is being revoked. The draft version of DP07 will be advertised in the Pilbara News and on the City’s website for a period of no less than twenty-one (21) days. Officers will also refer the draft policy to local builders who commonly make application to the City to vary the R-Codes and/or submit building permits.

STATUTORY IMPLICATIONS

In accordance with Clauses 4, 5 and 6 of Schedule 2 Part 2 of the *Planning and Development (Local Planning Schemes) Regulations 2015*, Council needs to determine whether it supports the proposed amended version of DP07. Should Council resolve to amend DP07, the updated draft version of the policy would be publicly advertised. Following the advertising period, submissions received must be reviewed and DP07 presented back to Council for final consideration. At that point, Council can resolve to either proceed with DP07 with or without modification, or not proceed with the LPP.

POLICY IMPLICATIONS

LPPs guide decision making on planning matters. Having up-to-date LPPs assists applicants in preparing applications and assists the City in making decisions.

FINANCIAL IMPLICATIONS

The City has factored all costs associated with reviewing Council’s LPPs into budgeting, including engaging consultants to assist with the review.

PURPOSE

For Council to consider the review of the TE-01 Community Facility Name Signs Policy.

BACKGROUND

Community Facility Name Signs are intended to meet Australian Standards, assist with direction (particularly for visitors), be consistent in appearance and be safe for road users and the public.

Officers have conducted an audit of current Community Facility Name Signs within the City of Karratha and it is evident that there are aesthetic inconsistencies, including non-compliance with the current policy. This review aims to provide a consistent approach moving forward and address the removal of existing signs that do not conform with the description of being a facility suitable for signage.

The current Community Facility Name Signs Policy TE-01 was last reviewed in June 2019 and although not due for review until June 2022, an opportunity now exists to strengthen the policy and the practices pertaining to the approval, installation, maintenance and removal (where appropriate) of such signs within the City's road reservations.

In addition to minor grammatical changes and rearrangement of text consistent with the policy headings, the following changes are proposed:

This review intends to streamline the process of application for Community Facility Name Signs, provide clear identification for the type of facility that can be signposted and remove signs that do not fit the policy facility description. New applications for signage will be reviewed and approved in accordance with this policy and as provided within Australian Standards, considering suitability, sign shape, colour, lettering, permitted information, location, and mounting so as to ensure compliance and consistency throughout the City of Karratha into the future.

Currently, as determined during the audit, 38 signs do not comply with the current policy, however with the proposal to include government departments, educational institutions and Day Care Centres, this would be reduced to 23 non-compliant signs. The 23 signs that remain consist of business/commercial operators not included as a suitable facility in the Community Facility Name Signs Australian Standard or included as an additional facility by Council. As such, Officers will discuss the policy implications with individual business operators and provide alternatives where possible, prior to removal of any existing signs.

LEVEL OF SIGNIFICANCE

In accordance with Council Policy CG8 Significant Decision Making Policy, this matter is considered to be of low significance in terms of Council's ability to perform its role.

COUNCILLOR/OFFICER CONSULTATION

Councillors have been recently consulted on the Community Facility Name Signs audit and the policy implications at its Agenda Briefing meeting held on 14 September 2020.

COMMUNITY CONSULTATION

Although no community consultation is required, it is recommended that the community be provided the opportunity to comment prior to its adoption.

Officers suggest a three week consultation period by way of local public advertising and if no material submissions are received within this time, it is recommended that the policy be adopted. Alternatively, community submissions will be presented back to Council for consideration following the advertising period.

STATUTORY IMPLICATIONS

Section 2.7(2)(b) of the *Local Government Act 1995* provides that the Council is to determine the local government's policies.

Australian Standards AS 1742.5:2017 and AS 1744-1975 are also applicable to this policy.

POLICY IMPLICATIONS

The reviewed policy is proposed to replace the existing policy following the community consultation period and consideration of submissions received.

FINANCIAL IMPLICATIONS

There are minor cost implications related to removal of the 23 redundant or non-complying signs. At a maximum, this is estimated at \$5,750 which is included in the Works budget.

Applicants are required to provide costs for installation and/or replacement which is in accordance with Council’s Fees and Charges for private works. Not-for-profit groups are exempt from installation fees.

For existing signs that do not comply with the policy with being a facility suitable for signage, but where it is determined that City approval was provided, consideration will be given to reimburse installation costs that were charged by the City at that time. This is expected to be minimal and addressed when discussing the policy implications with the affected individual business operators.

PURPOSE

For Council to consider the tender for the City Centre Re-landscaping offered under RFT 04-20/21.

BACKGROUND

In 2015, DevelopmentWA and the City undertook major redevelopment of the Karratha City Centre which included associated landscaping and beautification. On 9 February 2020, Tropical Cyclone Damien impacted the City with a direct hit causing substantial damage to the landscaping and associated infrastructure.

As a result, tenders were invited (under CEO delegation) on 2 September 2020 and closed on 23 September 2020.

The scope of works for the tender included, in brief:

- Identification and protection of existing services and infrastructure within the Works area;
- Coordination with services providers, local and statutory authorities, applications and ownership for appropriate licences and permits;
- Mobilisation and demobilisation to the Works area of all plant, equipment and materials required to complete the Works;
- Detailed Traffic management plan and implementation;
- Site survey and set out;
- Demolition, site clearing and grubbing including the protection of existing infrastructure;
- Earthworks as identified on drawings;
- Paving repair and installation as required;
- Installation of irrigation system including integration with the Effluent Reuse Scheme (ERS) and coordination with the appropriate utility suppliers;
- Supply, transportation and storage of all plant stock specified;
- Planting of all trees, shrubs and groundcovers as specified;
- Appropriate staking of all trees as specified;
- Supply and installation of all mulched areas.

One tender was received by the closing date from Yurra Pty Ltd.

The tender was evaluated by a three person panel comprising of:

- Manager Infrastructure Services
- Parks & Gardens Coordinator
- Technical Support Officer

The tender was first assessed for compliance with the tender documents. The tender was then assessed against the qualitative criteria that were weighted.

The criteria and associated weightings were:

The Regional Price Preference Policy was applied to the local tenderer.

A copy of the Evaluation Report is contained within the confidential section of the agenda.

PURPOSE

For Council to consider the Kevin Richards Memorial Oval Redevelopment Master Plan and staging.

BACKGROUND

At its meeting of 28 October 2019, Council resolved to accept the 2019 Kevin Richards Memorial Oval Site Concept Plan and commence the technical and design process including consideration for the location of the Rotary Club's Men's Shed. The Concept Plan was based only on alterations to existing facilities and documented the initial brief established from stakeholders could be accommodated on the existing site.

In the November 2019/20 Budget Review, Council allocated funds to the Kevin Richards Memorial Oval Redevelopment to engage a design consultant to progress the works. The Tenders for the design consultancy closed on 8 April 2020 with Council resolving to award this to the design firm, Peter Hunt Architects.

Peter Hunt Architects initially tested the feasibility of the October 2019 Concept Plan and formulated options, opportunities and constraints to revitalise the precinct across multiple fronts based on an order of priority, financial and needs basis.

Officers have previously acknowledged Kevin Richards as a Sub-District Facility, but its upgrade to a District Facility has been identified within the latest City's Recreational Facility Guidelines to meet the requirements of the catchment within the area. These requirements were highlighted by officers as key deliverables from the redevelopment.

In summary, the scope includes the consideration, of the following primary elements across the Precinct:

- Play space redevelopment including fencing, access and shade structures to activity zones;
- Pavilion refurbishment to accommodate Community Arts & Learning Groups together with other community hire usage opportunities;
- New sporting change room construction to align with AFL Guidelines for male and female teams together with City and Community requirements;

- The Karratha Football and Sporting Club expansion and refurbishment;
- Carpark formalisation, including provision for approximately sixty permanent car bays, bus parking, drop off and turnaround, with associated drainage and lighting together with temporary event parking strategies;
- Upgrade and replacement of sports lighting to the oval and hardcourts;
- Relocation and replacement of the cricket practice nets with consideration given to the proximity to car parking;
- Reorientation and replacement of the Karratha Volunteers Fire & Rescue Service running training track and associated infrastructure;
- Provision of space and associated services for the proposed Rotary Club Men’s Shed;
- Soft and hard landscaping throughout the Precinct linking activity nodes and creating a consistent and complementary palette and materiality for plantings, furniture, materials and signage;
- Allow and create safe pedestrian and cycle paths with consideration of the connectivity beyond the site boundaries improving access;
- Include the opportunity for artwork and commemorative interpretations at appropriate locations; and
- Extending and refurbishing the multipurpose hardcourts, including fencing.

During the master planning phase, three options were developed, including one that interrogated the 2019 Concept Plan (Option One), a single storey Master Plan (e.g. Option Two) attachment and a penultimate Master Plan (Option Three) Each of the Master Plan options were assessed against compliance with the established design brief and the list of key outcomes highlighted below:

- Locational information to allow for an advantageous precinct layout;
- The existing Building Condition Reports;
- Provision of a fit for purpose facility for the user groups;
- Provision of a multifunctional and flexible facility that allows concurrent uses;
- Increased access responding to the North/ South corridor; identified in the Karratha Revitalisation Report;
- Acknowledgement of the revitalisation strategy for the Lazy Lands around Kevin Richards Memorial Oval;
- Formal parking requirements in excess of 150 bays;
- Increase in spectator seating capacity;
- Optimised viewing experience for spectators;
- Achieving an efficiently of amenities requirements and accessibility requirements for community activities;
- Ease of access from district distributor road (Bayview Road);
- Achieving value for money with costing assistance of an independent Quantity Surveyor; and
- Achieving a District Level of facility as outlined in the City’s Facility guidelines.

Option Two meets all of these requirements, as well as allowing future-proofing and revitalisation of the Precinct. This option also has the potential for the staging of works to maintain current operations and the timing of any subsequent works pending the sourcing of associated funding compared to other options.

In addition to achieving the brief outcomes, Option Three sought to identify the development of the Precinct providing an optimum spectator experience and also looked at the additional site area provided by realigning Tilbrook Close. This option also proposed multipurpose courts suitable for competition given the synergies with the Club Room and increasing those available to local sporting groups within the City. The expanded court facilities would assist

with availabilities at peak times at the Karratha Leisureplex and allow the establishment of satellite training centres for the multipurpose courts such as those already established at Wickham. The satellite facilities promote an increased engagement of the community, particularly with increased participation in netball and basketball within the catchment area. Also, this provides an opportunity to increase the potential for inter-club competition and future expansion of court-based sports within the City.

A major component of the Master Plan is the proposed demolition and reconstruction of the Club Room. The existing facility is owned by the Karratha Football and Sporting Club and located on Crown reserve vested to the City, and have had a lease over land containing the Club room for 31 years. The facility has several constraints primarily its age and setback from the oval and viewing area, hence its retention prohibits several development opportunities that could provide a better functional relationship between uses of the site. With this in mind and noting the broader objectives of the master planning process, planning has focussed on developing a new club room and change room facility in a more suitable location that facilitates ease of access and increased amenity to service a wider range of community opportunities.

The relocation of a club room facility can only occur with the support of the Karratha Football and Sporting Club who have indicated a willingness to consider a new development. Issues of community use, capital costs, fit out and lease arrangements are likely to be key aspects to be resolved before any commitment to develop this facility progresses.

The City engaged independent Quantity Surveyors Wilde and Wollard to provide cost estimates at each stage of the master planning process. Given the cost implications of Option Three, an internal value management exercise sought to identify the key initiatives that could be presented to Council as pragmatic and financially achievable. The value management exercise focussed on cost saving opportunities being identified including:

- A reduction in earth banking around the building
- Removal of tiered seating and earth banking to the multi-use hardcourts
- Removal of the Tilbrook Close realignment
- Rationalisation of the level of the base fit out provided for the Club Room
- A single construction of the Club Room and Change Room to avoid temporary works
- A review of the size and amount of amenity required for the repurposed Pavilion
- Removal of the Karratha Volunteer Fire and Rescue Service Running Track from the site which could be relocated to a more beneficial location within the City.
- A review and reduction to the sports lighting provision

The current Master Plan and brief is based on a staged delivery. The most effective delivery solution would be to engage a contractor on a lump sum building contract which would allow for a number of beneficial outcomes in regards to relationships between the buildings and reduced construction costs. The Master Plan process has investigated both and identified that while the best option is a lump sum development, a staged approach can be used to minimise the effect on user groups and allow time to ensure an achievable cash flow for the delivery of the Master Plan. Proposed staging is listed below and estimated values of each stage are discussed further in financial implications.

The staging has been designed with the ability to respond to funding and community demand, and confirmation of the Master Plan will allow the immediate stages to process to detail design and construction with an overarching mandate.

Council is now requested to consider the design and cost implications of the Kevin Richards Memorial Oval Master Plan and if agreed, endorse the scope of works, and the staging to enable the works to progress.

Mobile Trading Vans

In August 2020 Council adopted the Stallholder & Street Trading Policy. In addition a transition plan will be prepared to implement the Policy from January 2020 and is proposed to include consideration for mobile trading as part of the Kevin Richards Memorial Oval Master Plan. While the overall review of the Precinct has identified a number of potential opportunities for consideration these are not covered in this recommendation. It is intended Officers will separately present a recommendation regarding the casual traders at Kevin Richards Memorial Oval for the November Council Meeting.

LEVEL OF SIGNIFICANCE

In accordance with Council Policy CG-8 Significant Decision Making Policy, this matter is considered to be of moderate significance in terms of social and wellbeing issues as it relates to the construction of significant community infrastructure.

COUNCILLOR/OFFICER CONSULTATION

At its meeting of 28 October 2019, Council resolved to accept the 2019 Kevin Richards Memorial Oval Site Concept Plan and commence the technical and design process including consideration for the location of the Rotary Club’s Men’s Shed.

Council has been regularly consulted, with concepts and indicative costings presented to the members of Council at the August 2020 and September 2020 Council Briefing Sessions. The consolidated feedback from both these sessions have been reflected in both the Master Plan and this report.

A further Council briefing was then provided on this report on 12 October to give an overview of the Master Plan and costs to be discussed in the council meeting on 19 October.

COMMUNITY CONSULTATION

Community engagement activities in accordance with the iap2 public participation spectrum process to inform, consult and involve have been undertaken throughout the project.

The Kevin Richards Memorial Oval Master Plan was reviewed and accepted by the key stakeholders directly impacted by the amendments made since September 2018 as follows:

STATUTORY IMPLICATIONS

There are no statutory implications.

POLICY IMPLICATIONS

Public Art Policy CS-12 talks to 2% of the intended construction cost of each capital works project being allocated to Public Art, and in accordance with the Policy it is proposed \$270,595.72 (excl. GST) representative of the overall construction cost is applied to the staging.

FINANCIAL IMPLICATIONS

Council has included \$1.6M in the 2020/21 Budget to commence the implementation of the KRMO Master Plan. It was envisaged that these funds would be used to design and construct the play space and to design and commence construction of the Change Rooms, noting further funds would be required to complete these works in the 2021/22 financial year.

The City has secured \$1,676,210.91 (excl. GST) in external funding date as follows;

- \$525,000 (excl. GST) from Lotterywest for the play space, Pavilion refurbishments and landscaping.
- \$375,000 (excl. GST) from the Department of Local Government, Sport and Cultural Industries for the change rooms.
- \$776,211 (excl. GST) from cash-in-lieu of public open space funds to assist in implementing the Kevin Richards Memorial Oval Master Plan.

Further, Officers have made an application for \$1,743,207.47 additional funding from the Department of Local Government, Sport and Cultural Industries CSRFF Forward Planning Grant for the playing field sporting lights in the Financial Year 2021/22.

The following table identifies the staging, the scope of works during each stage and current indicative cost estimates of each stage for Council’s consideration:

The \$13.9M project is indicatively broken into five stages but could be expedited or broken down into further stages should funding become available. Elements of the staging plan could potentially progress as funding/opportunities arise.

IMPACT ON CAPACITY

There is no impact on capacity or resourcing to carry out the Officer's recommendation.

Supervision of works and future maintenance programs are included in existing resources.

RELEVANT PRECEDENTS

Officers have identified Bulgarra Sporting Precinct, Wickham, and Kevin Richards Memorial Oval are all considered District Level facilities within the City.

The City's Recreational Facilities Guidelines define a District Level facility provides the following amenity:

- Minimum of two change rooms
- Dedicated facilities for umpires
- Dedicated facilities for First Aid
- Facilities compatible with AFL, Cricket Australia, Netball Australia and Department of Sport and Recreation competition guidelines.
- Large amounts of storage space
- A multiuse facility suitable for partnership with complimentary sports
- A kitchen/kiosk
- A sports pavilion suitable for liquor license
- Design allowance for player interchange/bench seating
- Spectator/public amenities
- Over 150 parking bays
- Shaded children's play space

The Bulgarra Sporting Precinct including the Frank Butler Community Centre is the logical equivalent comparison for the Kevin Richards Memorial Oval redevelopment, which was established, managed and funded by the City. The critical difference between the two sites is the location of the Karratha Football & Sporting Club Room located at Kevin Richards

which are independently owned and operated by the sporting club. As part of the redevelopment, the existing club room would be transferred to the City on the basis that both parties reach agreement on a long term lease. The main precedents for the Kevin Richards Memorial Oval Master Plan are the facilities identified as appropriate for a District Facility and those facilities already established at Bulgarra.

The redevelopment of Bulgarra Oval commenced with the new change rooms and the Frank Butler Community Centre resulting in a capital expenditure of approximately \$11.66M (excl. GST) over five years from July 2010 to June 2015.

The total facilities delivered at Bulgarra Oval occurred over an equivalent five year period and included in summary the following key elements:

- Frank Butler Community Centre including the demolition of existing facilities
- Sports change rooms and toilets including the demolition of existing facilities
- Formalised vehicle parking
- Provision of large storage spaces
- Upgrade of the multiuse courts
- Oval lighting upgrade
- Upgrade of sporting facilities to suite governing body guidelines
- Provision of a play space

CONCLUSION

The planning for the redevelopment of the Kevin Richards Memorial Oval is well advanced based on an extensive stakeholder consultation, resulting in a Master Plan that provides the most advantageous outcomes for the development of the Precinct. This process has interrogated and sought to further capitalise on the initial concept plan presented to Council in October 2019.

The construction works can be implemented in stages over several years in line with the availability of funding.

The project is seeking Council's consideration of the Master Plan to enable detailed design and documentation to proceed for Stage 1a.

OFFICER'S RECOMMENDATION

PURPOSE

To provide an update on the implementation of the nine (9) local small business and community support initiatives (Tranche 2).

BACKGROUND

At its Ordinary Meeting on 30 June 2020, Council adopted a second tranche of support initiatives valued at approximately \$1.3M to provide further support to local small businesses and community groups in need of assistance as a result of the COVID-19 pandemic.

Since March 2020, Council has committed a total of \$4.3M to stimulate the local economy in response to the pandemic.

Tranche 2 Business Support

The key drivers behind the small business stimulus initiatives (in order of importance) are:

1. Targeted approach - focussed on businesses/Individuals in most need.
2. Stimulate local business within the City district.
3. Rapid delivery – fast, yet transparent and rigorous.
4. Partnered – collaborative approach and/or no one else providing this type of support.

These objectives were canvassed with the local community in the community survey process to determine the appropriateness of the objectives. The community strongly supported the objectives, particularly the targeted approach to any spending and the focus on City of Karratha business owners.

Following is a status update on the Tranche 2 initiatives adopted by Council on 30 June 2020:

CONCLUSION

The City clearly has a role to play in supporting ratepayers, community groups and local businesses in responding to the impacts of the COVID-19 pandemic.

Since March 2020, Council has committed a total of \$4.3M to stimulate the local economy in response to the pandemic. Implementation of the second tranche of support initiatives adopted at the Ordinary Meeting on 30 June 2020 is well advanced with positive feedback received from local businesses, community organisations and the community at large.

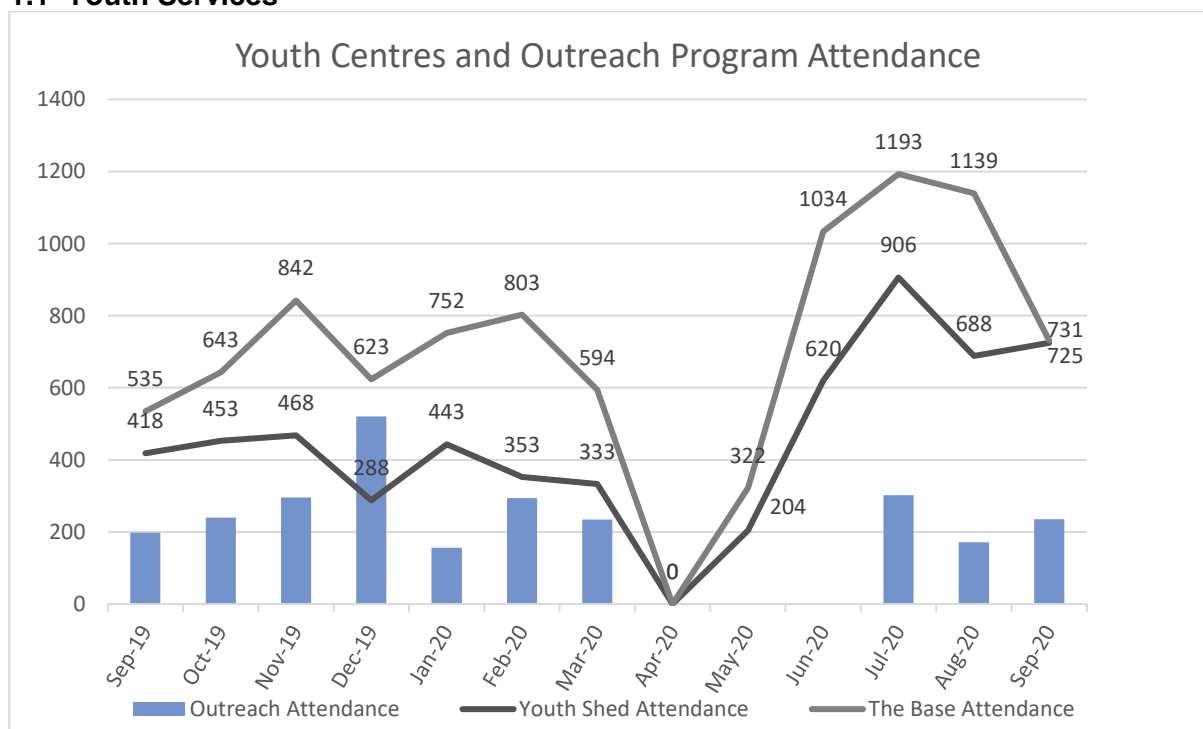

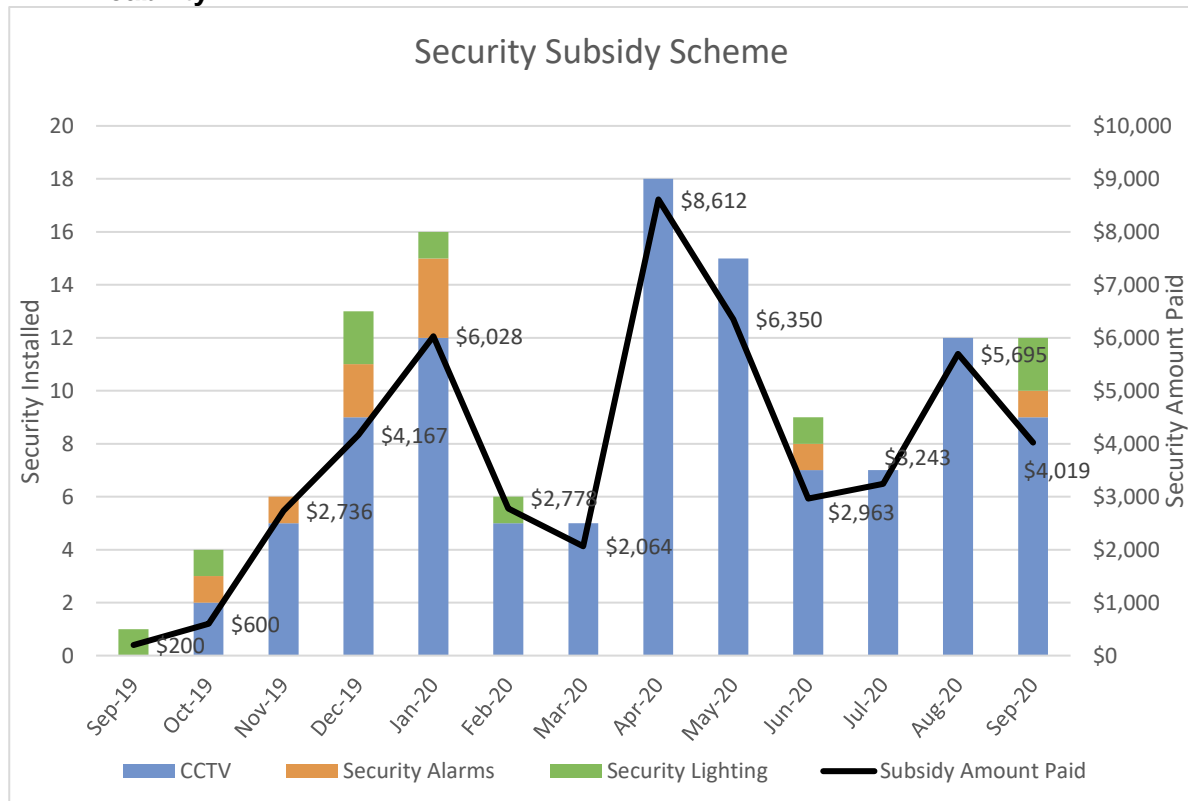

1.1 Youth Services

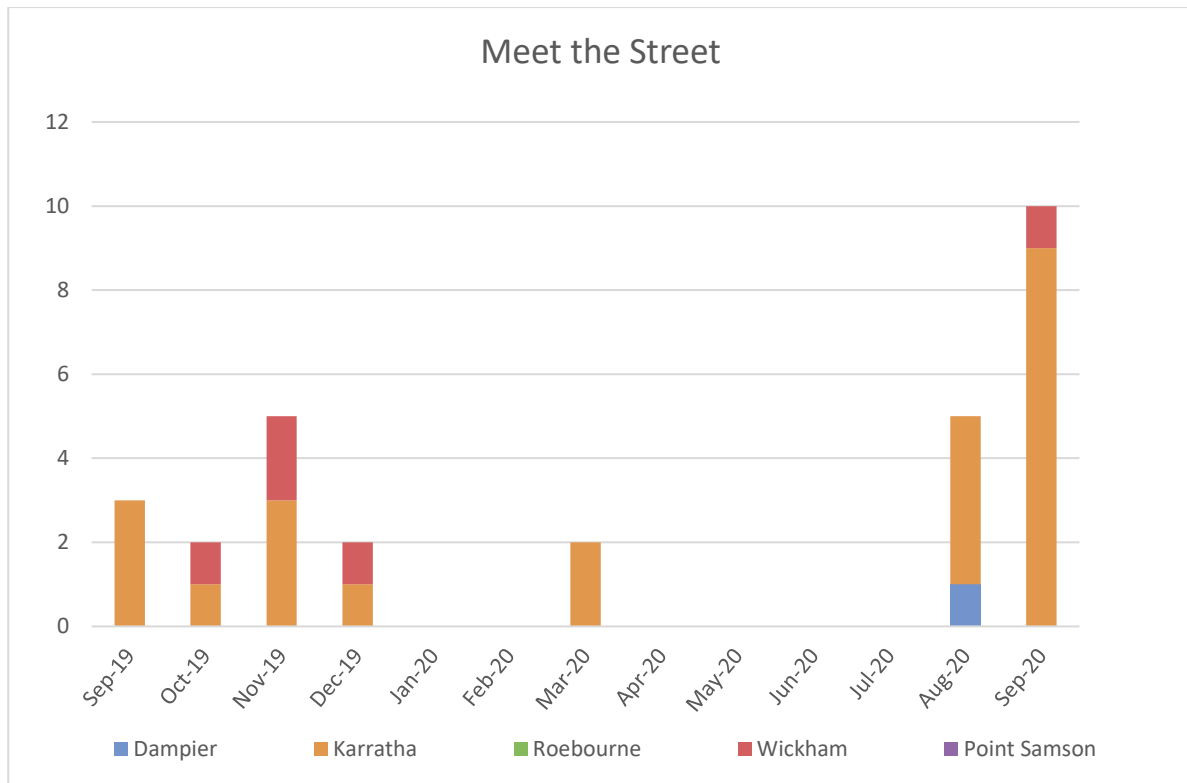


- Regular youth centre opening hours and outreach programs continue in Term 3. Both centres experienced significantly increased number of visits compared to the same time last year. In Sept 2019, The Base was open 21.5hrs/wk compared to 43hrs/wk in Sept 2020. The Youth Shed was open 19hrs/wk in Sept 2019 compared to 34hrs/wk in Sept 2020.
- Attendance at The Base declined from Aug to Sept 2020. Anti-social behaviour and vandalism in the WCH area could have impacted perceived safety of The Base and Wickham Skate Park, negatively impacting attendance. Vandalism caused a 3-day closure of The Base during Sept.

1.2 Liveability

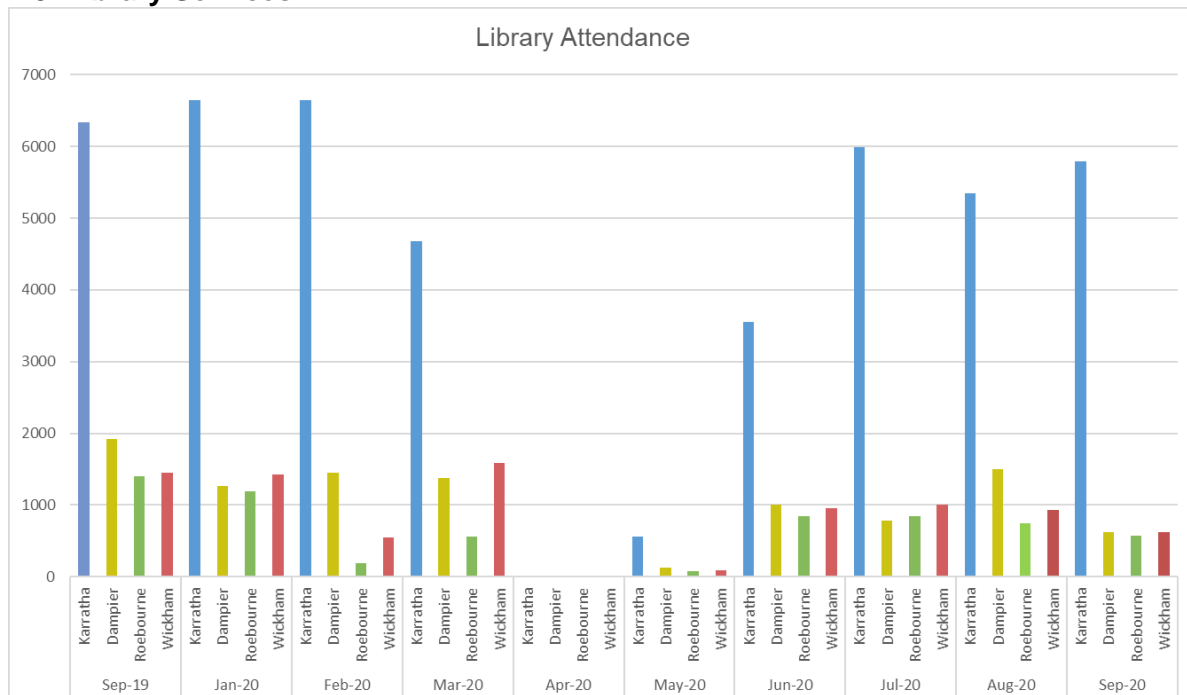
