## **Physical Description**

The building is constructed of stone with walls measuring approximately 450 mm thick, forming two rooms approximately 5 m². The house is surrounded by a 3 m wide verandah which has been filled in to form extra rooms. The simple hip roof is of corrugated iron with a separately pitched skillion roof over the verandahs. The windows to the central core are fitted with timber cyclone shutters.

## History

This house was built for John Goldsmith Meares, who bought the land from his father-in-law, John Withnell, part of Lot 1, Withnell's original land grant. Meares purchased three quarters of an acre from Withnell in April 1891 for two hundred pounds.

In approximately 1914 the property was transferred to Harry John Watson.

Dalgety and Company purchased the property on 23 December 1952.

Richard Edmund Fenny purchased the building in 1977.
